**Answer:** TCMF and DCMDG have a role in the development of code modifications whereas Charging Futures' role is to look at developing longer term direction for change to electricity network charging

## General Charging Futures

**Question:** Can I still raise a mod?

**Answer:** Yes, Charging Futures does not prevent modifications from being raised however before raising a modification proposal. Charging Coordination Guidance from Ofgem will be uploaded shortly to help you understand what, when and how you might best raise a modification to fit with the change programme.

**Question:** Is the Targeted Charging Review (TCR) the same scope as the charging Significant Charging Review (SCR)?

**Answer:** The scope of the SCR is to review residual charges at transmission and distribution for both generation and demand and to keep other 'embedded benefits' under review. The TCR includes the SCR within its scope alongside the treatment of storage at transmission and distribution levels.

**Question:** Is the SCR part of Charging Futures?

**Answer:** The SCR is not a formal part of the Charging Futures arrangements like the Taskforces are however as it is a significant area of change to electricity network charging, it will require coordination alongside Charging Futures.
